

Certificated Automotive Engineer - CAE

To qualify for the award of CAE, the applicant requires **one** of the following nationally recognised qualifications or an IMI Automotive Technician Accreditation (ATA). The applicant should also have at least three years' relevant experience and evidence of approved qualification/technical skills.

Advanced Automotive Engineer - AAE

To qualify for the award of AAE, the applicant requires **one** of the following nationally recognised qualifications or an IMI Automotive Technician Accreditation (ATA). The applicant should have either **held CAE for two years** or have at **least five years' relevant experience**.

Level 4 Vocational Competency Qualification (VCQ) in Vehicle Maintenance & Repair

Level 4 National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) in Vehicle Maintenance & Repair

Level 4 Vocationally Related Qualification (VRQ) in Vehicle Maintenance & Repair

City & Guilds Full Technological Certificate (FTC) or Licentiateship (LCGI)

BTEC/SCOTVEC Higher National Certificate (HNC) or Diploma (HND) in the following;

- Vehicle Technology
- o Accident Repair

Only BTEC/SCOTVEC technically-based HNC/HND units will be accepted. (Some higher qualifications only have management units). For example, in Motor Vehicle that means Engine Faults Diagnosis, Chassis Faults Diagnosis, and Electrical & Electronic Faults Diagnosis. For Motor Body the units are typically Electrical and Electronic Faults Diagnosis, Body Fault Finding, and Paint Fault Finding.

IMI – Automotive Technician Accreditation (ATA) – Issued by the IMI

Valid accreditation in one of the following;

- o ATA Light Vehicle Master Technician
- ATA Motorcycle Master Technician
- o ATA Roadside Assistance Master Technician
